

ITLS Saskatchewan is Honoured to have Hayley Wickenheiser present at the 2019 ITLS Education Day

Seven Championships; Six Olympic appearances; Five Olympic medals; Four Olympic Gold medals - Hayley Wickenheiser is a titan of sport and a leader both on and off the ice and considered one of the best female players in the game. Hayley's ascent to the top of the sport started in Shaunavon, Saskatchewan when at age 15 she was the youngest member chosen from the Canadian Women's National team. Her Olympic career spanned 23 years, five Olympic medals and two sports, as she also competed in softball in Sydney 2000. In 2014 she was Canada's official flag bearer and she now serves on the IOC Athletes Commission and is the Vice Chair of the Calgary 2026 Bid Committee. She is currently studying Medicine at the University of Calgary where she spends as much time as possible outdoors and with her son Noah, who is now 18 World years old.



HUMBOLDT DISCUSSION PANEL – MODERATED BY HAYLEY WICKENHEISER

The Humboldt Bronco's tragedy continues to have a profound effect on Saskatchewan and the World. No training in the world prepares us mentally or physically for an incident like this. A panel of responders involved in the Humboldt incident will discuss some of their operational experiences. What lessons were learned? How did teamwork effect this incident? What would they do differently "next time"? Hayley Wickenheiser will be the moderator for this emotional discussion.

LEADERSHIP AND RESILIENCE – HAYLEY WICKENHEISER

Aside from Hayley Wickenheiser holding four Olympic gold medals, being one of the most recognized women in sport, and a dedicated advocate of women's hockey; Hayley is also an engaging storyteller who enjoys connecting with Canadians. What are some of the barriers that Hayley has overcome? It takes leadership, persistence, hard work and resilience to achieve goals. However, a person can never do this alone. It also takes teamwork, team unity and a common goal. It is all within our grasp, no matter what profession, what industry, what calling we have chosen. Hayley will share some of her experience and challenges with leadership, motivation and resilience.

RADICALIZATION TO VIOLENCE - CONSTABLE RYAN MACLEOD

Constable MacLeod will cover some common questions around the process of radicalization. What exactly is radicalization? Are radicalization and terrorism the same thing? How can I recognize someone who is becoming radicalized? What can I do if someone I know is becoming radicalized? This presentation will answer these questions, as well as show some first-hand videos of people's experience with the process of radicalization to violence.

TRAUMA CASE STUDY - DR. TERRY ROSS

Dr. Terry Ross is the Provincial Medical Director for ITLS Saskatchewan. In addition to his emergency medicine practice, Dr. Ross is involved in emergency medicine education. He currently serves as an ED Echo Ultrasound Course Instructor, an Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) Instructor/Medical Director, a Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) Instructor/Medical Director, a University of Saskatchewan Clinical Assistant Professor, and is also a primary presenter at the STARS Cardiac Skills Institute.



Dr. Ross is currently the Head of the Department of Emergency Medicine for the Saskatchewan Health Authority (for the former RQHR – Regina General and Pasqua Hospitals) and an emergency physician, the Medical Director of the STARS Regina Base, and a STARS transport physician.
